January 10, 2023 is the deadline to submit a request for test accommodations for March 1st.

1 CREATE A COLLEGE BOARD ACCOUNT

You'll need a College Board account to view your SAT® scores when they're ready. You can also search for colleges and build a college list. If you don't have an account yet, create one at <u>collegeboard.org/mysat</u>. All junior who took the PSAT in the Fall should already have an account. Log in, however, to check your information and make any updates.

2 DECIDE WHERE TO SEND YOUR SCORES

On or before test day, you can choose which colleges, universities, and/or scholarship programs to send your four free score reports to. Be ready with your list. The SAT is accepted by all U.S. colleges. Learn more at sat.org/send-scores.

3 SIGN UP FOR FREE PRACTICE ON KHAN ACADEMY

Official SAT Practice on Khan Academy® is FREE for all students and the best way to prepare. It includes videos, eight full-length practice tests, and thousands of practice questions with instant feedback. Sign up at satpractice.org for your personalized study plan.

4 EARN BIGFUTURE SCHOLARSHIPS

5 Log into your College Board Account and look at your PSAT results to get customized tutoring assistance and plans.

Engineering Brighter Futures

Get a head start on your Texas A&M engineering degree by applying for the Texas A&M-Chevron Engineering Academy at the Alamo Colleges District – Northeast Lakeview College. Offered in partnership with Texas A&M University's College of Engineering, this unique program offers students an opportunity to pursue an engineering degree while co-enrolled at Texas A&M and the Alamo Colleges District. Students are able to save money during their first two years – when they will take engineering courses taught by Texas A&M faculty at Northeast Lakeview College before transitioning to the Texas A&M campus in College Station. The Texas Workforce Commission projects a 25 percent growth in engineering jobs statewide in the next decade.

Why the Academy?

The Texas A&M-Chevron Engineering Academy offers students:

- Admission to the College of Engineering at Texas A&M University-College Station from day one.
- An opportunity to take Texas A&M engineering courses from Texas A&M faculty on the NLC campus.
- An opportunity to join a community of Engineering Academy peers by taking math, science, and engineering courses with other Engineering Academy students.
- An opportunity to participate in student activities and organizations at both institutions to the extent possible.
- An affordable pathway to earning a Texas A&M engineering degree.
- Guaranteed full admission to Texas A&M upon successful completion of the two-year program.
- An opportunity to apply for early entry into a degree-granting major within the College of Engineering at Texas A&M, if qualified.

The Engineering Academy at Alamo Colleges District - Northeast Lakeview College is for Alamo Colleges District students who have achieved a high school diploma or equivalent and are pre-calculus or calculus ready as determined by NLC.

Interested students must:

- Be able to maintain full-time student status each semester at the Alamo Colleges for at least one year before transitioning to A&M.
- Satisfy **one of** the math readiness criteria to be qualified for the Engineering Academy:
 - COLLEGE CREDIT: Your current college transcripts show credit for College Algebra, Trigonometry, Precalculus, or Calculus I with a grade of A, B, or C.
 - HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT: If you are a current high school student and have completed Algebra II, Honors Precalculus, Pre-Ap Precalculus, or AP Calculus course with a grade of A, B, or C.
 - STANDARD EXAMINATION: Have an ACT math score of at least 26 or an SAT math score of at least 581.

Steps to Apply:

- Complete the Alamo Colleges District Admissions Application
- Complete the **Pre-qualification Form**
- Submit proof of math-ready status to nlc-engineering@alamo.edu

Alamo Colleges will provide pre-qualified students the link to the Texas A&M Engineering Academy Application. Successful applicants will receive an offer of admission from Texas A&M University to the Engineering Academy at Alamo Colleges District. They will be advised on how to accept the offer and register for courses.

Note: New NLC students must take the SAT or ACT prior to applying to Texas A&M University.



TSIA2 Testing

Initial Testing for 10th, 11th, and 12th grades wrapped up prior to Winter Break. There will be additional opportunities for students to test starting in February. Qualifying TSIA, SAT or ACT scores are required to enroll in Dual Credit classes for the 2023-2024 school year!!

Complete the Pre-Assessment

This pre-assessment is required by the state of Texas to be completed **BEFORE** a student can take the TSI. It also provides students with more information about the TSI as well as valuable practice.

- * Students must create an account for the Practice APP if one has not already been created. Use your personal email address.
- * After successfully logging in, select Texas Success Initiative 2.0 Pre-Assessment Activity (TSIA-2-PAA)
- * Click on Begin Pre-Assessment Activity
- * Choose New Braunfels High School as the campus where you plan to take the TSIA2
- * Forward your Certificate of Completion to Ms. Norbury, kerrynorburykubicki@nbisd.org or Mrs. Horner jhorner@nbisd.org. You will not be allowed to test unless Ms. Norbury or Mrs. Horner has a copy of your Certificate of Completion

2023-2024 Course Registration

Counselors have been meeting with Juniors and will be meeting with Sophomores to have initial conversations about the schedules for next year. Students have the opportunity to enroll in Dual Credit classes after they have taken & met scores on the TSIA2. OnRamps courses do not require the TSIA2, however, they are equally as challenging and rigorous. Below is information for both programs. We may be adding additional classes to both programs, this is a preliminary list.

DUAL CREDIT - offered through Northeast Lakeview College

- **Must meet TSIA, SAT or ACT minimums to be eligible to register for Dual Credit classes.
- **Must complete the ApplyTexas application/ Northeast Lakeview College and select Fall 2023

Dual Credit college courses are designed to challenge students by exposing them to college level work while still in high school. Students are typically successful in these programs if they are responsible, task oriented, proficient readers, and capable of effectively managing their time. Motivation is key to being successful in these rigorous courses. Students should be able to deal maturely with sophisticated concepts and to persevere in the face of a challenge. The decision to take Dual Credit college courses is extremely important because the courses, grades, and credit hours will be on your college transcript forever. Recommendations for success: (1) Don't take too many at a time. (2) Consider other obligations and time commitments. (3) Practice good study skills and follow directions and syllabus without reminders. (4) Ask questions, participate in class, and ask for assistance when needed.

ONRAMPS - offered through UT Austin

OnRamps works through a dual enrollment model. Using a hybrid delivery approach, students meet rigorous university-level college readiness standards and have the opportunity to earn UT Austin credit from a UT faculty member and high school credit from their local teacher. All OnRamps courses can be applied to the Texas Common Core and are guaranteed to transfer to any public institution in Texas. https://onramps.utexas.edu/

Eligible students may elect to enroll in an OnRamps course for a letter grade. If the student earns and accepts credit in the course, the grade will appear on the student's university transcript. A letter grade of D- or better is considered passing.

OnRamps college credit earned for a letter grade of C- or above for courses with a Core Curriculum designation are required by law to transfer to any public higher education institution in the state of Texas. These are noted in the Texas Core Code column in the below table.

Scholarships for High School Seniors: Tips for Searching & Applying!

Look, the search and application process for scholarships for high school seniors is not always a smooth-sailing process. But, the fact that you've made it this far in the post and are taking the initiative to learn more about scholarships is a great start in itself!

Here are a few quick tips to help you along your scholarship journey...

1. Set goals for yourself along the way.

- I was a high school senior not too long ago, so I know exactly what it's like to have to create a balance between your schoolwork, extracurriculars, college applications, and scholarships.
- It's not always an easy task, but that's why you should work on setting goals for yourself and creating a scholarship strategy!
- Your goals should be SMART (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant/Realistic, Timely). Setting goals for things such as how much you are aiming to earn from scholarships and when you will set aside time to search and apply will help you to stay on track with what you want to achieve.

2. Know where to look.

- The <u>Access Scholarships Search Engine</u> is an awesome resource with tons of scholarships for high school seniors. But beyond Access Scholarships, be sure to...
- Reach out to your school counselor to discuss some of the local scholarships that are out there for you to apply for
- · Head over to your state's financial aid website to learn more about their grants and resources

3. Apply often.

- Don't think of the scholarship process as one that you can engage in only once every few months and see success with.
- The scholarship process requires consistency and dedication. If you want to have the best chance at winning
 scholarships, you need to be dedicated to the process (creating a healthy mix of mostly essay scholarships with some
 no-essay scholarships is a good strategy) and put in the effort!

4. Be organized, thorough, and on time.

• Lots of students find it helpful to organize their scholarship application and search process using a spreadsheet (virtual or physical). These are extremely useful because you can keep track of important deadlines, requirements for each scholarship, and more.

5. Think outside the box.

- I have provided you with a ton of great scholarships for high school seniors right here in this post.
- In addition to these, don't be afraid to venture out to find scholarships that are specific to YOU in all aspects! This means thinking critically about your hobbies and interests, and passions outside of academics.
- It also means thinking about things that define who you are that you could potentially leverage in your scholarship search. For example, are you a soon-to-be first-generation college student? Or maybe you're planning on pursuing a STEM degree? These are just two areas that you can identify and use to search for scholarships!
