#### NBISD THROUGH THE YEARS

- Educating youth for more than 100 years
- Evolved from a small schoolhouse to 15 campuses
- Educating more than 9,100 students
- More than 1,200 employees
- Last bond election in 2015 for \$62.8 million passed with 70 percent approval



# ENROLLMENT GROWTH

- Comal County is 2<sup>nd</sup> fastest growing county in the nation\*
- Largest NBISD student enrollment growth was in 2017-2018 school year
- NBISD has grown by 2,600 students in past 15 years
- Projections show district will nearly double in size in next 10 years
- Projected student enrollment at build-out will be nearly 20,000



# INTERNAL GUIDELINES

- Only address projects needed within next
  5 years
- Balance capacity & facility needs
- Keep within scope of full build-out plan
- Leave options open for future
- Enhance School Safety & Security
- Minimal tax implications



# **BOND TIMELINE**

- Jan. 2017 Facility Planning Committee (FPC) began meeting monthly
- February 2018 FPC Recommends Bond
- March 2018 Board Calls \$106.7 Million Bond Referendum for Nov. 6, 2018
- June 25, 2018 Board Amends Bond to be \$118.3 Million to Accommodate Additional Safety & Security



# FPC BOND PRIORITIES

- Address growth at middle school level
- Demolish Ninth Grade Center Building
- Address older elementary schools (Carl Schurz, Seele, Lamar)
- Keep use of portable buildings as temporary solution
- Expansion of support facilities

- 73% of NBISD's campus facilities are more than 20 years old
- 46% are more than
  55 years old
- Oldest campus is
  95 years old

- New Middle School COST: \$54 million
  - Relocate NBMS students
  - 1500-student design
  - Build next to Klein Road Elementary
  - Accommodate projected student growth on east side of school district
  - Opens August 2021













#### RELOCATE 9<sup>TH</sup> GRADE CENTER

- Relocate Ninth Grade Center to NBMS
  - Next step toward second high school
  - Ready to go when enrollment dictates
  - Will be a three year plan
    - 1<sup>st</sup> Year 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup>
    - 2<sup>nd</sup> Year 9-11
    - 3<sup>rd</sup> Year 9-12
  - Opens August 2021
  - Expected to be 9-12 no later than 2025-2026



# Ninth Grade/Future High School



## NEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

- New Elementary COST: \$29 million
  - Replacement for Carl Schurz (built in 1935)
  - Replacement for Seele (built in 1950)
  - 850-student capacity, two-story design
  - Build on existing Ninth Grade Center site
  - Open August 2023

## **VERAMENDI ADDITION**

#### COST: \$3.75 million

- Opened August 2017
- Built for 750 capacity
- Near capacity first year
- Addition of eight (8) classrooms
- Additional 196 seats of capacity

### Renovations - continued

- Demolish NBHS Ninth Grade Center Building (Built in 1952) and relocate NGC to current NBMS
  - Estimated Cost: \$1 million
- Move Fiber from DAEP Building to Administration Building
  - Estimated Cost: \$240,000



# SECURITY ENHANCEMENTS

#### \$6.6 Million in Projects

- Proximity Card Readers at all campuses
- Security Bollards at all campus drop-off/pickup areas
- Security Cameras at All Elementary Schools
- Enclose/Harden Reception Areas at schools
- Electronic Exterior Door Locks on Office Doors
- Ballistic Glass Film at Campus Entryways



# ATHLETICS

- Construction of four (4) Tennis Courts to NBMS and ORMS
  - Estimated Cost: \$2.3 million
- NBHS Baseball Field Renovations
  - Estimated Cost: \$1.1 million

#### \$3.4 million in Projects

(Equates to 3% of overall bond package)



## TRANSPORTATION

- Parking lot maintenance, replacement and expansion for growth (built to TXDOT specs)
- Purchase buses for growth & replace older buses (over 5-year period under short-term bond)

#### **Estimated Cost: \$6 million**



# TECHNOLOGY

- Teacher & Staff computer replacements (rotate over 5-year cycle)
- Student iPad replacements (3 grade levels each year over 4-year cycle)
- Classroom Technology upgrades & replacements
- District Wifi, Network & System Upgrade

#### Estimated Cost: \$5.4 million

(5-years of purchases to be funded by short-term bond)



#### POTENTIAL TAX IMPACT

- 0-cent up to 4-cent tax increase per \$100 valuation of residence
- Highest rate potentially in 5th year at 4 cents
- Drop back down in 6<sup>th</sup> year with steady decrease
- RESIDENTS 65 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER WOULD NOT SEE A TAX INCREASE (with homestead paperwork processed)
