The Law

The most recent law that affects Title 1 is the No Child Left Behind Act (Public Law 107-110(1118)). The law requires:

- o That school districts have a written policy regarding parental involvement;
- o That parents be involved in the design, operation and evaluation of Title 1;
- o That parents be consulted about home/school activities and be trained to help their children;
- o That whenever possible, activities should be presented in the language spoken by the majority of the Title 1 parents.

Purpose

The Title 1 program is designed to meet the needs of all children attending Seele Elementary. Title 1 programs are also designed to improve the educational opportunities of underachieving children and help them:

- *Succeed in regular programs*
- *Attain grade level proficiency, and*
- *Improve their achievement in the basic and more advanced skills Title 1 funds help support our school district to provide staff and educational services.*
