Dear NBISD Parents/Guardians:

Earlier today, Texas Governor Greg Abbott [issued Executive Order No. GA-16](#) relating to the safe, strategic reopening of select services as the first step to Open Texas in response to the COVID-19 disaster. In relation to public schools, the Governor's order contains the following guideline for public schools:

**“In accordance with the Guidelines from the President and the CDC, schools shall remain temporarily closed to in-person classroom attendance by students and shall NOT recommence before the end of the 2019-2020 school year. Public education teachers and staff are encouraged to work remotely from home, if possible, but may return to school to conduct remote video instruction, as well as perform administrative duties, under the strict terms required by the Texas Education Agency.”**

New Braunfels ISD will continue to provide Instructional Continuity via our online learning to our students through May 28, 2020, in accordance with Texas Education Agency guidelines. Student completion of assignments is essential to help us determine grade placement (promotion and retention) for elementary students and for course credit for middle school and high school students. We need your support and involvement in encouraging your child(ren) to complete their assignments.

We will be sending another communication to you next week regarding how grades will be calculated for the last grading period, which is from March 16 through May 28, 2020.

As the Governor's Executive Orders will begin to reopen public places over the next few weeks, I encourage you to follow all safety precautions provided by the Centers for Disease Control. The safety and security of our families will continue to be our number one priority.
