# NBISD Registration

- **ALL** parents of returning students will need to go on-line and complete an the **ON-LINE ENROLLMENT VERIFICATION** form for each child that attended NBISD last year.
  - Online Enrollment Verification went live on Monday, August 3
  - Online Enrollment Verification ends on Friday, August 21

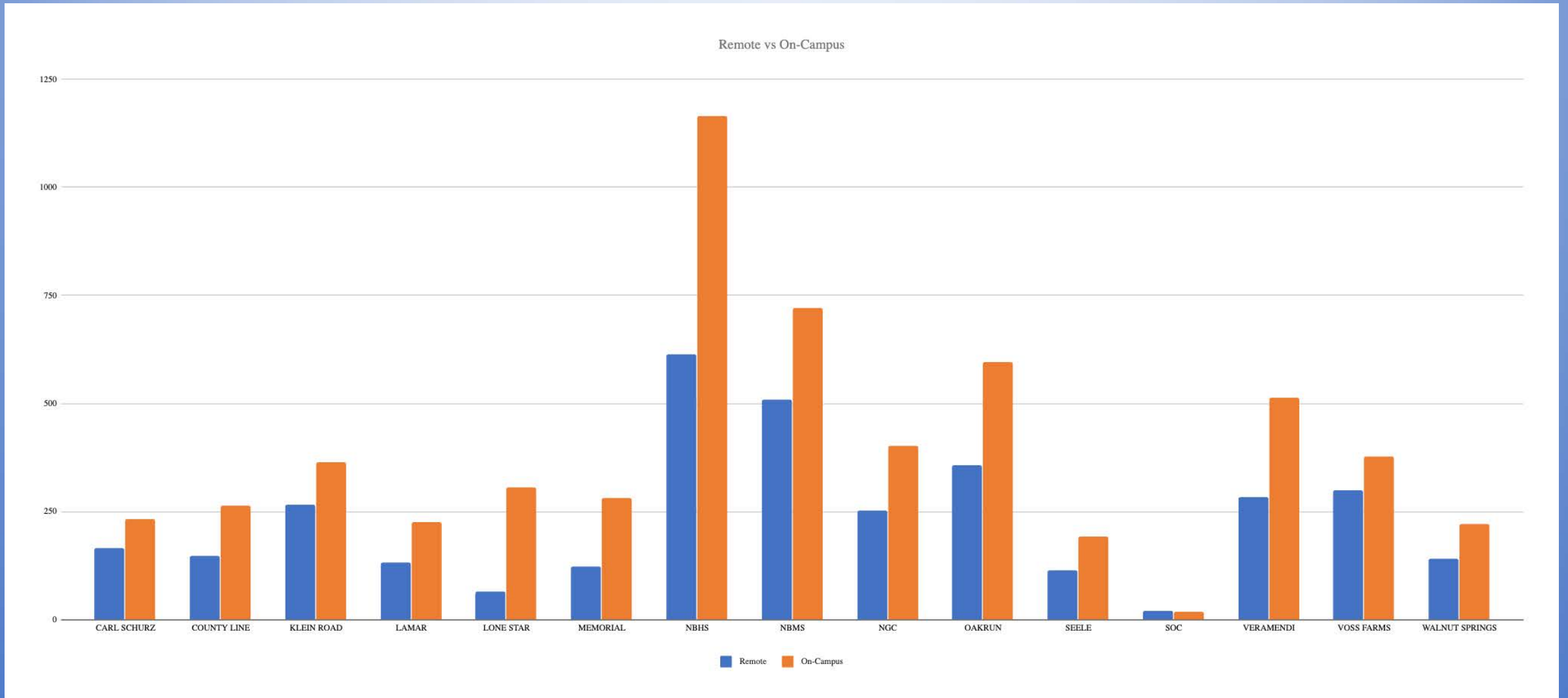

# NBISD REMOTE LEARNING

Steps we are taking to prepare for the start of school

- Campus and district administrators working diligently
  - Determining how many classes/course sections of REMOTE LEARNING
  - Assigning teachers to REMOTE LEARNING
  - Assigning REMOTE LEARNING students to teachers
- Scheduling for ON-CAMPUS LEARNING
- Assigning ON-CAMPUS students to teachers

# NBISD REMOTE LEARNING

- Secondary students choosing remote learning for this school year and participating in a Elective classes, may need to come on campus for that class.
- Examples are Athletics, Cheer, Dance, Ag. Power Systems, Animation, etc.
- Each secondary campus will communicate with parents the specific classes for that campus that will require students to attend in person.

# NBISD iPad Distribution Plan for REMOTE LEARNING

- Only for **REMOTE LEARNERS** who filled out **REMOTE LEARNING** application
  - Must have completed the Remote Learning Application by August 9.
  - Must reserve a time and day. The link for reservation was sent to you via email.
  - Must have completed Online Registration at least 24 hours prior to pick up.
  - All iPad claims paid from previous year.
  - Must know your child's Student ID number.
- **Protection Plan**  
Don't forget, you can purchase our optional NBISD protection plan for your child's iPad. This is a purchase per school year, so any payment plan purchase you made last school year does not apply to the 2020-2021 school year. # NBISD Face Mask/Face Shield Guidelines

## Approved face coverings

- Face masks
  - Non-medical grade disposable paper face masks that are at least two-ply
    - No ventilation devices in mask
  - Cloth face masks that cover the nose and mouth and made from at least two layers of fabric
  - Gaiters may be worn, but they must be constructed with two layers of material
    - Gaiters that are only one layer are not allowed, unless they are folded and stitched so that they may not be worn as a single layer
    - Folding or doubling over of single layer gaiters is not allowed
  - Bandanas are not allowed
- Face shields which wrap around the sides of the wearers face and extend below the chin to protect eyes, nose and mouth
  - Face shields that attach to hats or caps are not allowed

# NBISD Face Mask/Face Shield Guidelines

- **ALL** persons, including students Pre-K through 12<sup>th</sup> grade, entering or exiting an NBISD building **WILL** wear a face mask or face shield
- Face masks or face shields **WILL** be worn in hallways, libraries, restrooms and other common areas
- Face masks or face shields **MAY** be removed in a classroom or other learning space only if it is possible to maintain at least six foot of distance between every person in the room
- Face masks or face shields **will not be required** while eating lunch
- Face masks or face shields **will not be required** at recess or physical education, however social distancing will be at least six feet between every person

# Superintendent Plea

- The number of cases of COVID-19 skyrocketed in July
  - Several contributing factors
    - Memorial Day weekend
    - Large crowds of people
      - No social distancing
      - No masks being worn
- We are seeing steady declines in COVID-19 numbers, however, I have concerns
  - I continue to see large groups of students around our community who are not social distancing and not wearing masks
  - I continue to see postings on Facebook of large groups of students gathering for end-of-summer, back-to-school parties, etc. who are not social distancing and not wearing masks

# Superintendent Plea

- Recommendations for a **HEALTHY START** and a **STRONG FINISH**
  - The incubation period for COVID-19 is 12 to 14 days
    - We still have 12 days left before the start of school
    - Encourage all employees and students to practice social distancing between now and the first day of school
    - Encourage masks when social distancing cannot be maintained
  - Why?
    - **PROTECT OUR TEACHERS AND OTHER EMPLOYEES, they are at a higher risk than our students**
      - **If teachers become ill, it may significantly impact student learning**
    - In most extracurricular programs, especially band, athletics, cheer, etc. where masks will not be worn, **ONE STUDENT** testing positive and having direct contact with team members **CAN END THE SEASON** for the entire team

# Superintendent Plea

- **STUDENTS CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE**

- It has to **START NOW**
- **STUDENT LEADERS** need to spread the message to all students
- **SENIORS** this is your chance to have some control over your senior year

**IF WE WANT TO START HEALTHY AND FINISH EVERY SEASON AND ACTIVITY STRONG, STUDENTS MUST BUY INTO SOCIAL DISTANCING AND WEARING MASKS IN GROUPS BOTH AT SCHOOL AND AWAY FROM SCHOOL.**

# Comal County COVID-19 Data as of Monday, August 10, 2020

- **Comal County Total COVID-19 Cases from Beginning to Today**
  - 15,690 tests conducted
  - 1,839 confirmed cases
  - 547 probable cases
- **Location of confirmed cases – by area of county – 2,231 (confirmed & Probable)**
  - 1,821 from the New Braunfels area, including eastern and central Comal County
  - 334 from western Comal County, including Bulverde and Spring Branch
  - 117 from south of Canyon Lake
  - 59 from north of Canyon Lake, including Fischer
  - 47 from southern Comal County, including Garden Ridge and Schertz
  - 8 from Fair Oaks Ranch



# Comal County COVID-19 Data as of Monday, August 10, 2020

## Comal County – July Data

- 1,115 new cases reported in July
- Over 69.6% of the cases were added in July

## Comal County – Other Statistics

- 19 additional recoveries for a total of 1,869
- 59 total deaths
- 455 active confirmed and probable cases
  - Down from 806 last week
  - Down from 1,121 two weeks ago
- 69 currently hospitalized (up from 56 last week)

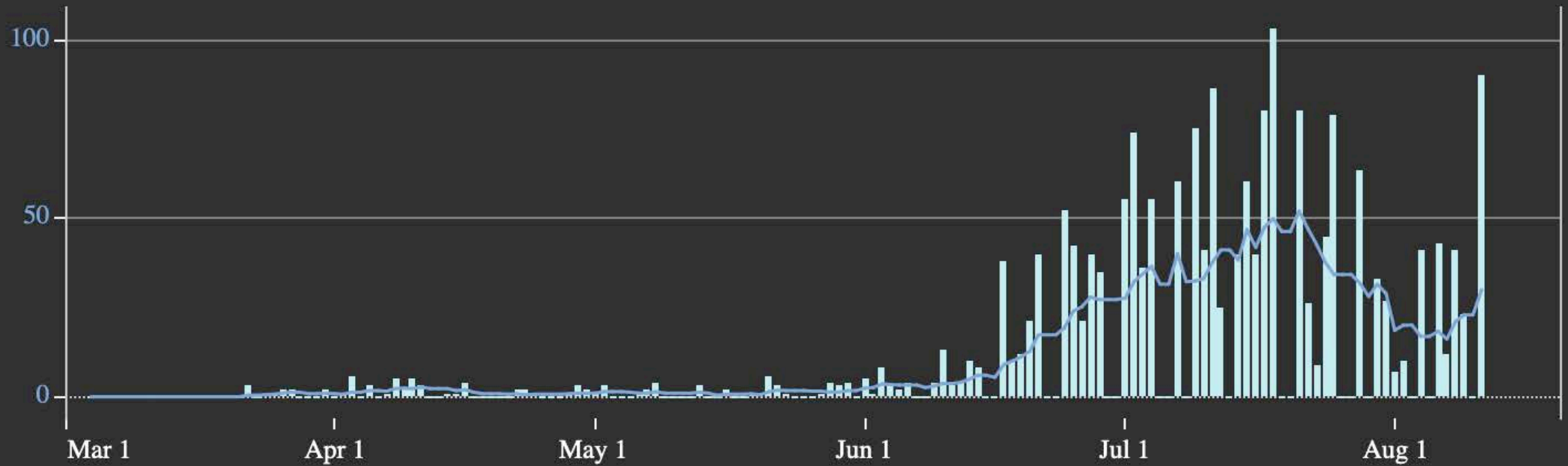
# Comal County COVID-19 Data

## Positivity Rate as of Monday, August 10, 2020

- **Positivity Rate**
- Definition: The positivity rate is the daily percentage of people testing positive for COVID-19 in relation to the total number of people tested that day.
- **Comal County Positivity Rate as of Tuesday, August 4, 2020 = 15.48%**
  - This is up from 16.57% last Monday

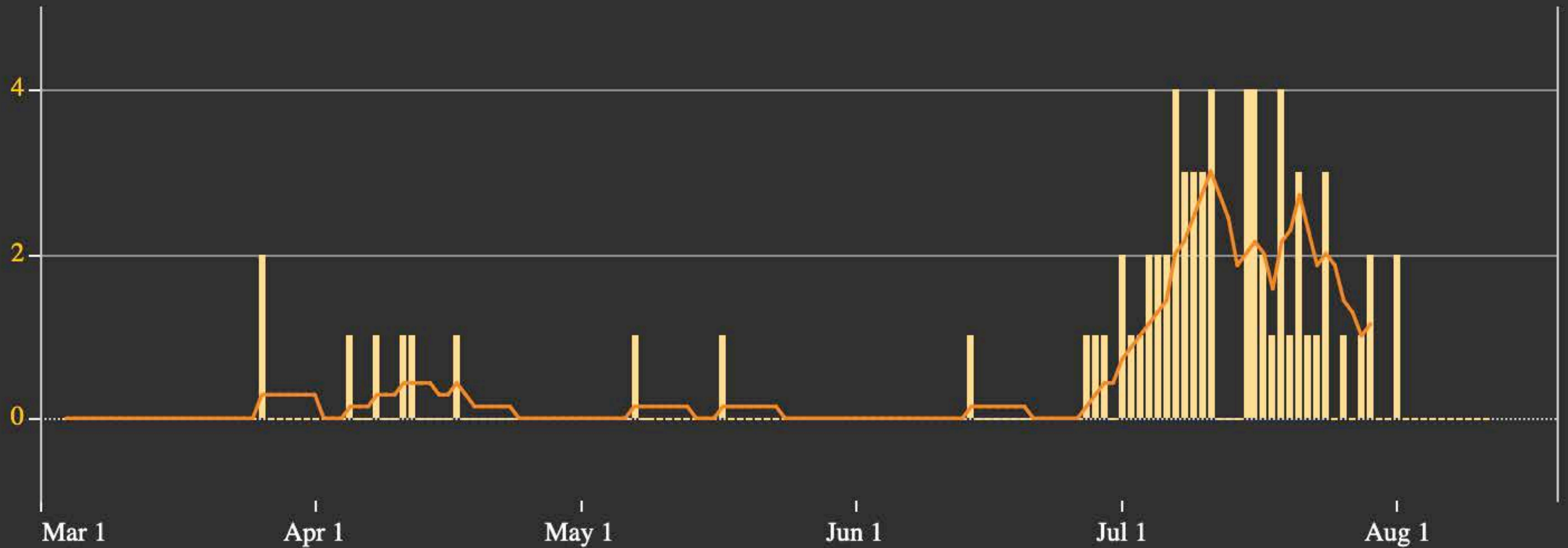
# Texas DSHS COVID-19

Daily New Confirmed Cases in *Comal County*



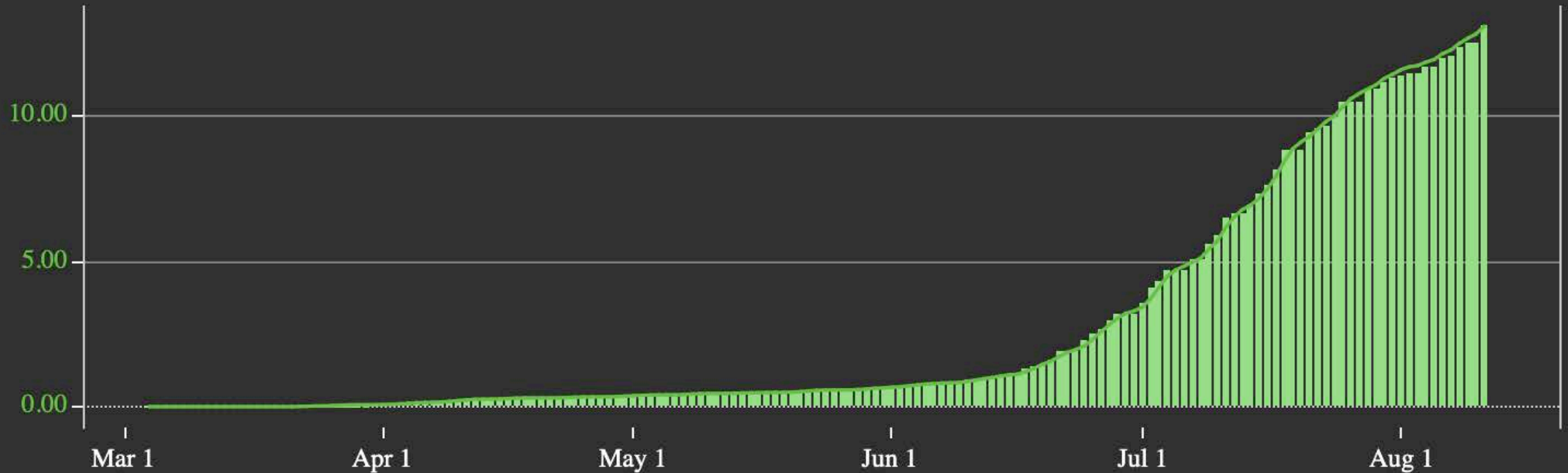
# Texas DSHS COVID-19

Fatalities by Date of Death in *Comal County*



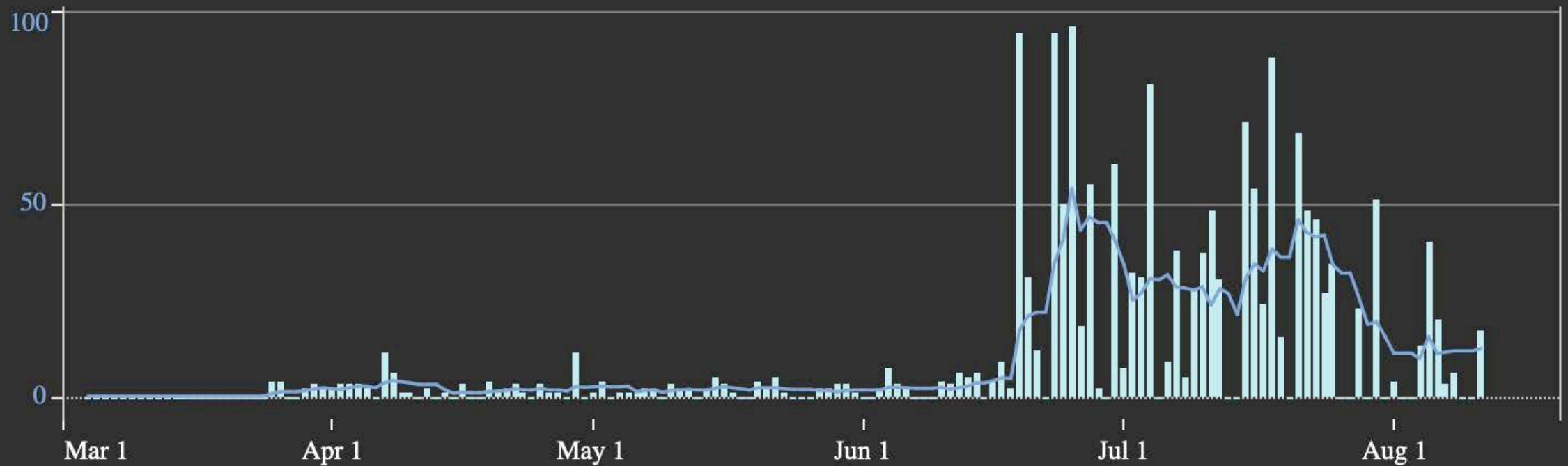
# Texas DSHS COVID-19

Total Confirmed Cases Per 1,000 Persons in *Comal County*



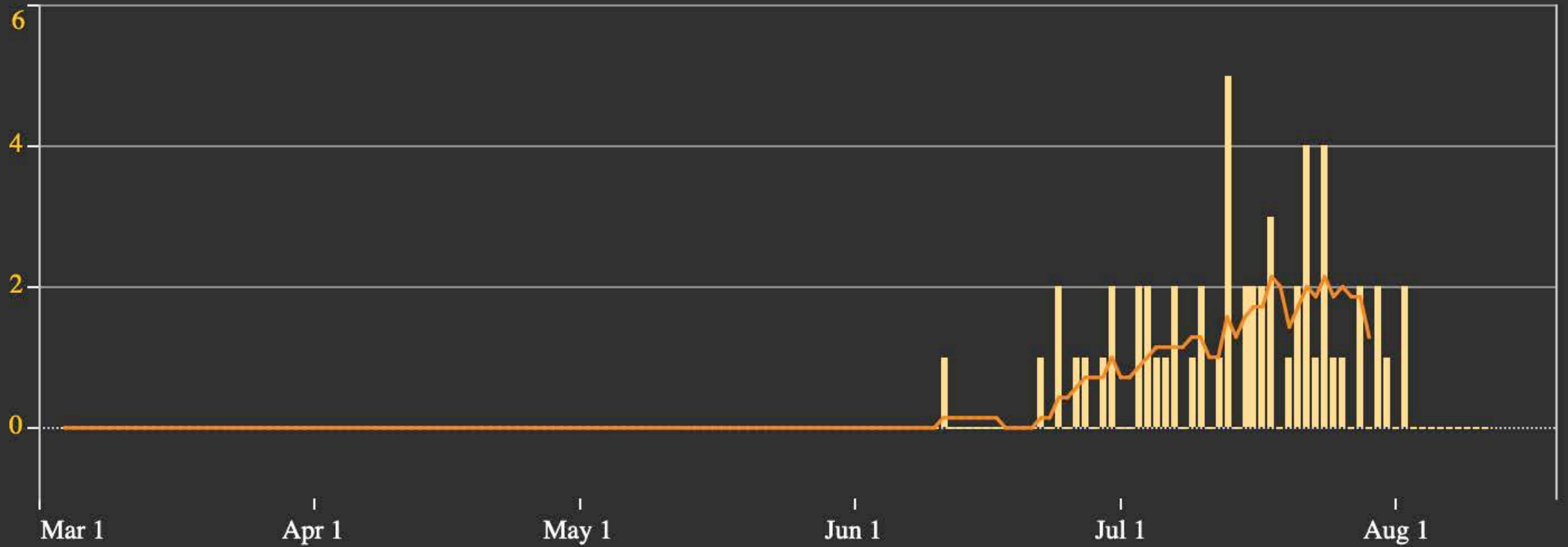
